

PACKAGING AND DISPOSAL INFORMATION

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This document provides information on the packaging materials that may be used for the packaging of materials manufactured by Sonae Arauco and supports their proper identification, separate collection, sorting and disposal after use.

The applicable European legal framework for packaging is Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on packaging and packaging waste (PPWR), applicable from 12 August 2026. This Regulation establishes harmonised rules across the European Union with the aim of reducing packaging waste and improving packaging sustainability, reuse and recycling.

The table below identifies the packaging materials that may be used by Sonae Arauco and indicates the corresponding material abbreviations and material codes to support appropriate sorting and disposal.

After use, packaging should be separately collected and sorted in accordance with the applicable local waste management rules and collection systems in the country or municipality where the packaging becomes waste. Users should therefore always verify the specific disposal instructions issued by the relevant local authority or authorised waste management system.

Where required under applicable legislation, packaging may be additionally labelled with specific sorting instructions or recycling information.

This document provides general information on the packaging materials typically used by Sonae Arauco. Packaging configurations may vary depending on the product, plant, market, customer specification, logistics solution or order-specific requirements. More specific information may be provided upon request for a particular product or packaging configuration.

This document relates only to the identification and disposal/sorting of packaging materials and does not replace any product specific packaging label or marking, transport or commercial documentation, product technical documentation, or any country-specific registration, reporting or extended producer responsibility (EPR) obligations applicable to the relevant economic operator.

This information is valid for materials sold to any market, provided that the packaging configuration corresponds to the materials listed above.



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
